





LEDP Training of Mushroom

Project Brief

Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programme (LEDP) on Mushroom Cultivation

Uttar Dinajpur District, West Bengal

Implementing Agency: Daspara Nabadisha Education & Welfare Society (DNEWS)

Supporting Agency: NABARD, Government of India

Project Duration: 2 Years

Training Structure: 7-Day Intensive Training per Batch

Total Batches: 4

Participants per Batch: 30

Total Beneficiaries Covered: 120

The LEDP on Mushroom Cultivation aims to promote sustainable livelihood opportunities for rural women in Chopra & Islampur Block of Uttar Dinajpur district. The programme enhances beneficiaries' skills in scientific mushroom cultivation, processing, and market linkage to ensure long-term income generation.

Key Components of the Project

a) Skill Development Training

- Each batch received 7 days of hands-on training on mushroom cultivation.
- Training included techniques on substrate preparation, spawn management, shed preparation, pest/disease control, harvesting, and packaging.
- Special focus was given to Oyster, Button, and Milky Mushroom cultivation.

b) Enterprise Development Support

- Guidance on forming SHG-based micro-enterprises.
- Support in business planning, cost estimation, and income projection.
- Linkages with local markets and aggregators facilitated.

c) Capacity Building & Handholding

- Post-training handholding for enterprise setup.
- Advisory support on raw material procurement and infrastructure development



AGM & DDM, NABARD Site Inspection

A field visit to the mushroom beneficiaries' site was conducted in October 2024 by the AGM, WBRO, NABARD, along with the DDM the training sessions to:

- Review the progress of training activities.
- Interact with beneficiaries to understand their learning outcomes.
- Provide direction for strengthening enterprise development and marketing linkages.
- Appreciate the efforts of DNEWS in mobilizing and empowering rural women.



Exposure Visit

An exposure visit was organized by Daspara Nabadisha Education & Welfare Society (DNEWS) to:

- Help participants observe successful mushroom cultivation units.
- Learn practical models of value addition, packaging, and commercial-scale production.
- Understand real-market functioning and interaction with experienced cultivators.



Expected Outcomes

- 120 rural women trained in scientific mushroom cultivation.
- Establishment of cluster-based mushroom units for income generation.
- Strengthened SHG livelihood portfolios through enhanced agri-allied skills.
- Improved economic resilience and women empowerment in the region.

Summary of Program

The LEDP Mushroom 2.0 initiative, organized by Daspara Nabadisha Education & Welfare Society (DNEWS) with support from NABARD, successfully strengthened livelihood opportunities for rural women in Uttar Dinajpur District. The two-year programme included four batches of seven-day intensive mushroom cultivation training, covering a total of 120 beneficiaries. Participants received hands-on exposure to production techniques, spawn preparation, hygiene practices, and enterprise management.

Exposure visits and field demonstrations enhanced participants' practical understanding, while regular follow-up ensured sustained engagement. The project promoted skill development, encouraged micro-enterprise creation, and contributed to income diversification for women-led households. The intervention also supported SHG strengthening and aligned with NABARD's broader mission of fostering rural entrepreneurship.

NABARD DDM Mr. Arnab Pramanik visited the training programme to review the progress and motivate the participants. The visit reinforced the importance of skill-based livelihood promotion under LEDP Mushroom 2.0. The guidance and encouragement provided by the DDM greatly inspired the beneficiaries.

Glimpse of Program



MEDP Training of Mushroom



The MEDP on Mushroom Cultivation, implemented by Daspara Nabadisha Education & Welfare Society (DNEWS) through its own corpus in Chopra and Islampur Blocks of Uttar Dinajpur, aimed to promote sustainable livelihoods for rural women through scientific mushroom farming and enterprise development.

The programme provided hands-on training in substrate preparation, spawn management, shed preparation, pest and disease control, harvesting, processing, and hygienic packaging, with a focus on Oyster, Button, and Milky mushrooms suited to local conditions. In addition to technical skills, beneficiaries received guidance on forming SHG-based micro-enterprises, cost estimation, income planning, and market linkages, enabling them to start and manage small mushroom production units. Continuous post-training handholding supported raw material procurement, infrastructure setup, and enterprise stabilization, helping participants generate regular income and strengthen their economic self-reliance.

Program Outcome :

- ❑ Rural women acquired practical skills in scientific mushroom cultivation, enabling them to start production at the household and group level.
- ❑ Several beneficiaries initiated SHG-based micro-enterprises, creating a new and sustainable source of income.
- ❑ Participants gained confidence in business planning, cost management, and market engagement, improving their financial independence.
- ❑ Regular mushroom production improved household nutrition and enhanced local availability of high-protein food.
- ❑ The project strengthened women's role in the local economy and contributed to sustainable livelihood development in Chopra and Islampur blocks.



Nabadisha Group of Institutions & Skill Development Program



Daspara Nabadisha Education and Welfare Society (DNEWS), through its Nabadisha Group of Institutions affiliated with the National Board of Computer Education & Information Technology Development Board, continued its commitment to women's empowerment in 2024–25 by delivering comprehensive skill development programs for underserved women. Along with its regular courses in tailoring, beautician services, computer literacy, and small business management, DNEWS introduced a new Jewellery Making Skill

Development initiative to expand income-generation opportunities. During the year, 49 women completed tailoring training, 9 students completed computer training, and 18 underprivileged women were trained in jewellery making, while beautician training continued in ongoing batches. The program also provided mentoring on financial planning, entrepreneurship, and self-confidence, enabling participants to pursue self-employment, start micro-enterprises, and achieve sustainable livelihoods, thereby strengthening their economic independence and social dignity.



Furtir Haat – Community Awareness & Youth Engagement Program



Project Brief: DNEWS, in association with NYK Jalpaiguri and UNICEF West Bengal, organized a community-focused program on Furtir Haat at Bholapara, Rajganj, Jalpaiguri. The initiative aimed to raise awareness among adolescents, youth, and local community members on health, hygiene, child protection, and positive behavioral practices. Through interactive sessions, demonstrations, and open discussions, participants were sensitized on essential life

skills, safe practices, and government support mechanisms. The programme also strengthened community engagement and encouraged youth participation in social development activities.

Program Outcomes

1. Enhanced awareness among adolescents and youth on health, hygiene, and child safety issues.
2. Increased community understanding of UNICEF-supported initiatives and NYK-led youth engagement processes.
3. Strengthened local participation, fostering a supportive environment for behavioral change and community-led action.
4. Mobilized youth volunteers for future awareness and outreach programmes under Furtir Haat.
5. Improved linkage between community members and support services related to health and protection.



Youth Livelihood Development through Professional Painting Skills



Program Brief: DNEWS, in partnership with Sambhav Foundation, collaborated with AkzoNobel Paint Academy, Delhi, to implement a 26-day skill development program aimed at improving livelihood opportunities for unemployed youth. The initiative provided industry-oriented training in professional painting, surface preparation, safety practices, color application techniques, and finishing skills in line with AkzoNobel's quality standards.

As part of this initiative, DNEWS organized a local-level Decorative Painting Training Program for youth aged 18–35 years. A total of 25 participants successfully completed a 16-day intensive day-boarding training, where they gained hands-on experience in modern decorative painting methods, surface treatment, safety protocols, and professional finishing.

Project Outcome: The program achieved a strong outcome with 75% of trained youth placed in relevant jobs or linked to self-employment opportunities through structured placement support. In addition, a one-day day-boarding exposure and orientation meeting was organized in collaboration with Sambhav Foundation and AkzoNobel Paint Academy, engaging 60 youth participants to create awareness on career pathways, industry expectations, and skill certification. Overall, the initiative strengthened youth confidence, improved job readiness, and opened sustainable livelihood avenues in the professional painting and construction sector.



MEDP on Handmade Jewellery training

Project Brief: DNEWS, with support from Own corpus, implemented a Micro Enterprise Development Program (MEDP) on Handmade Jewellery to promote livelihood opportunities among women SHG members.



The training aimed to equip participants with practical skills in designing, crafting, and finishing various types of handmade jewellery, including beadwork, thread jewellery, oxidized sets, and contemporary designs.

Through hands-on sessions, demonstrations, and guided practice, women gained confidence in production techniques, quality control, costing, and basic marketing

strategies. The program also highlighted enterprise development opportunities, enabling SHG members to start small-scale jewellery businesses or enhance their existing income activities.

This MEDP initiative strengthened women's entrepreneurship, encouraged home-based micro-enterprises to vision of improving rural livelihoods through skill-based interventions.

Outcome of Project :

The training enhanced women SHG members' skills in designing and producing quality handmade jewellery. Participants gained confidence to start or improve their own micro-enterprises. The programme strengthened livelihood opportunities by enabling women to generate sustainable income through home-based jewellery production.



Towards a Healthier Community

Community Support to TB Patients Project Ni-Kshai Mitra

Under the Ni-Kshai Mitra initiative of the Central Health Ministry and the West Bengal Health Department, DNEWS provided community-based support to TB patients at Daspara PHC, Chopra, and Uttar Dinajpur. The programme focused on improving treatment adherence, reducing stigma, and ensuring timely access to nutrition and essential services. By regularly supplying nutritious food kits and engaging frontline workers, DNEWS strengthened patient morale and contributed to better recovery outcomes. The intervention helped bridge gaps between public health services and vulnerable households affected by TB.

DNEWS distributed nutritious food kits to registered TB patients at Daspara PHC & Chopra RH to enhance immunity and support treatment effectiveness. The initiative aimed to reduce the nutritional vulnerabilities commonly faced during TB treatment, especially among economically weaker families. Through regular follow-up and counselling, the programme ensured that patients remained motivated to complete their medical course, reinforcing a community-driven approach to public health improvement.

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**One Day Workshop on HIV/AIDS, Sensitization program**

DNEWS organized a one-day sensitization workshop on HIV/AIDS with support from NYKS, focusing on awareness-building among youth, community leaders, and local stakeholders. The workshop covered key topics such as transmission, prevention, stigma reduction, and available government support services. Drug Addictions & Substance abuse Program

The Drug Addiction and Substance Abuse Programme conducted by DNEWS aimed to educate adolescents, parents, and community members about the risks associated with drug use and substance dependence. The initiative highlighted early warning signs, psychological impacts, and available de-addiction support services. Through motivational talks, discussions, and preventive messaging, the programme encouraged young people to make informed decisions and created a supportive environment for individuals seeking help. Supported by NYKS, the campaign played a significant role in reducing vulnerability and fostering a healthier society.



Operation Smile Project



DNEWS partnered with the INGA Foundation, Bengaluru, and Avalon Hospital, Siliguri, to implement Operation Smile a free medical camp offering cleft lip and palate surgeries for children and adults from economically weaker backgrounds. The project ensured early identification of beneficiaries, pre-screening, counseling, and logistical support for families. By restoring facial deformities and improving speech, nutrition, and social acceptance, the initiative transformed lives and provided renewed confidence to affected children. This humanitarian collaboration strengthened access to specialized healthcare for underserved communities.



Environment & Climate Change Initiatives

Plantation Drive



DNEWS organized a community-led Plantation Drive aimed at enhancing local green cover and promoting environmental awareness. A total of 30 participants took part in the initiative, actively engaging in planting and nurturing saplings. During the drive, more than 200 of plants were planted across designated community spaces, schools, and public areas. The programme encouraged eco-friendly behavior, strengthened community participation, and contributed toward long-term climate resilience in the region.

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Survey of Climate Change

DNEWS is conducting an extensive Climate Change Perception Survey across Uttar and Dakshin Dinajpur to understand local environmental shifts, community vulnerability, and adaptive practices. The survey engages 50 of participants/respondents, including farmers, women, youth, and SHG members, to collect data on temperature changes, rainfall patterns, livelihood impacts, and coping mechanisms. The findings will support evidence-based planning for climate action and help design targeted community awareness and adaptation programmes.



Swachhata Hi Seva Campaign



Under the national Swachhata Hi Seva 2024 campaign, DNEWS, in association with DTNBWED, Siliguri Region, Govt. of India, conducted a special registration drive for Safai Workers of Rajganj Block, Jalpaiguri. The programme facilitated on-the-spot enrollment in social security schemes, ensuring access to welfare benefits and improved occupational dignity. A total of 20 Safai Workers participated in the event, receiving guidance on entitlements, documentation, and available government support systems.

Water Security & Climate Change Action Awareness cum Capacity Building Program



DNEWS organized a comprehensive awareness and capacity-building programme on Water Security and Climate Change Action to empower communities with practical knowledge and adaptive solutions. The session was attended by Number of participants, including youth, farmers, SHG members, and local stakeholders. The program covered water conservation, climate-resilient practices, disaster preparedness, and sustainable natural resource management. Participants gained improved

Rural Bio Technology




DNEWS has established a Rural Biotechnology Two-Pit System to promote sustainable waste management and organic manure production at the community level. The system enables the scientific decomposition of biodegradable waste into nutrient-rich compost. This initiative supports eco-friendly farming practices while reducing environmental pollution. It also helps rural households and farmers adopt low-cost, sustainable agricultural inputs.



Awareness cum registration camp on social security schemes



DNEWS organized an awareness and registration camp to inform vulnerable communities about available social security schemes and support them in completing enrollment formalities. The camp focused on expanding access to welfare benefits such as insurance, pensions, and financial protection, ensuring that marginalized households receive the support they are entitled to. This initiative aimed to

Seminar on Consumer Protection ACT 2019

A seminar was conducted by DNEWS to create awareness among consumers about their rights under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019. The session covered key topics including grievance redressal mechanisms, product liability, unfair trade practices, and online consumer safety. Through interactive discussions and practical examples, participants gained a clear understanding of how to seek justice, file complaints, and effectively address consumer-related issues in their daily lives. The program was organized with financial support from the Government of West Bengal through the CAFBP, Jalpaiguri District Regional Office, and was conducted in schools and colleges.”



Awareness Program On Solid Waste Management

This program promoted environmentally sustainable practices by educating communities on waste segregation, recycling, composting, and responsible disposal. Participants were encouraged to reduce household waste, adopt cleaner habits, and contribute to maintaining a hygienic and eco-friendly environment.



Awareness Generations Program on Child Rights

Awareness Generation Program on Child Marriage & Child Labor DNEWS conducted a community sensitization drive highlighting the legal, social, and psychological impacts of child marriage and child labor. The program urged communities to report violations, promote education, and ensure a safe and supportive childhood for all children.



Awareness Generation Program on Human Trafficking

This initiative aimed to raise awareness about the risks, indicators, and preventive actions related to human trafficking. Participants were informed about safe migration practices, legal frameworks, and reporting mechanisms, strengthening community vigilance and protection of vulnerable groups.



Financial & Digital Literacy Program



The financial and digital literacy program equipped participants with knowledge on banking services, online transactions, digital payments, budgeting, and fraud prevention. The initiative encouraged responsible financial behavior, improved access to digital services, and empowered individuals to participate safely in the digital economy.



Awareness Generation Program on Personal Hygiene

The hygiene awareness program promoted healthy practices such as hand-washing, menstrual hygiene management, sanitation, and cleanliness among participants in Schools, Colleges, and Madrasas across Uttar Dinajpur and Jalpaiguri districts, contributing to improved wellbeing and community health.”



Other Welfare Initiatives

Siksha Ashray – Orphaned Children Education Program



Siksha Ashray Orphaned Children Education Program, run entirely through the own corpus funds of Daspara Nabadisha Education and Welfare Society (DNEWS), supports the education of orphaned and semi-orphaned children aged 6 to 14 years across three village-based learning centers, benefiting around 30 highly vulnerable students. The program provides free academic coaching three days a week in their own villages, along with essential learning materials such as notebooks and pens, ensuring that no child is excluded from education due to financial hardship. By using its own resources, DNEWS demonstrates its strong commitment to social responsibility, helping these children continue their schooling, strengthen basic learning skills, and move toward a more secure and dignified future.

DTNBWED , Shramik Chaupal Programme Government of Inida

The Shramik Chaupal Programme was conducted at Rajganj Block of Jalpaiguri District – West Bengal by the Siliguri Regional Directorate of the Ministry of Labour & Employment. The initiative informed workers about labour laws, social security schemes, e-Shram registration, and rights of unorganized sector workers. DNEWS facilitated community mobilization, and 200 workers participated actively, receiving guidance on accessing welfare benefits and grievance support.



Strengthening Existing Boys' Collectives on Positive Masculinity Program NYK

DNEWS, with the support of Nehru Yuva Kendra (NYK), organized a capacity-strengthening program for existing boys' collectives focused on promoting gender equality and positive masculinity. The sessions emphasized self-awareness, respectful behavior, challenging harmful gender norms, and developing leadership for social change. A total of 30 adolescent boys and youth members participated, strengthening their ability to act as peer educators and role models who promote non-violence, mutual respect, and gender-equitable attitudes within their communities.



Career Counseling & Guidance Program



DNEWS conducted a Career Counseling and Guidance Programme aimed at helping students and youth make informed career decisions. The session covered higher education options, vocational training pathways, competitive examinations, skill development opportunities, and job readiness. A total of 35 participants attended the programme, receiving personalized guidance and resource materials to

support their future aspirations.



Cloth Distribution to underprivileged SC/ST communities



DNEWS organized a cloth distribution drive to support underprivileged SC/ST families, ensuring warmth, comfort, and basic dignity during difficult economic conditions. The distribution covered essential clothing items for children, women, and elders. A total of 50 beneficiaries from marginalized tribal communities received support, reinforcing DNEWS's commitment to inclusive welfare and community care.




UNICEF–NYK State Level Review Meeting on Youth & Social Development




